## 2005 Ontario Chapter AGM at Geneva Park - Orillia

Due to closure of the Leslie M. Frost Centre the Annual Meeting of the Ontario Chapter will not be held in Dorset for the first time in our Chapter's history. However, we are very excited to offer our membership the amenities available at Geneva Park in Orillia for the 2005 Annual General Meeting of the Ontario Chapter. We have tried to select a venue that provides similar features to the Frost Centre - features that were enjoyed by our members over the years. The Executive Committee considered a number of possible venues factoring in things such as cost, location and suitability. Cost was a significant factor and through negotiations with Geneva Park and an aggressive sponsorship campaign we have succeeded in offsetting the higher accommodation costs and have developed a reasonable cost structure. We have continued to offer extremely reasonable rates for students (\$50.00 increase from previous years) to ensure that we continue to have strong student attendance. This was achieved by subsidizing student attendance through the application of slightly higher costs to non members and established professionals, as well as through the dollars graciously provided by our sponsors. We

realize that the cost structure is higher than in the past years and we hope that our membership recognizes the efforts made by the Executive Committee to maintain a high quality AGM at a reasonable price. Another notable change to our AGM will be the reduced flexibility in the registration process. It is important for everyone to register early so we can provide information to Geneva Park in a suitable timeframe to allow for effective meal planning, and to ensure that penalty charges will not be applied. The final registration deadline is 23 February, 2005. So register now and avoid the rush. It should also be pointed out that the accommodations are different than the Frost Centre; Geneva Park offers bathroom/shower facilities in each room for your added comfort. ## **DFO Invites Public Comment on Draft Wild Salmon Policy**

On December 17th, 2004 the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) announced a 60 day public comment period for their draft Wild Salmon Policy (WSP). If you'd like to provide input, the deadline for submissions is February 18th, 2005. The Canadian Aquatic Resources Section of AFS (CARS) will also be developing a Section position on the policy.

The draft policy sets conservation goals, develops management strategies and seeks to balance social, economic and biological benefits and risks to the pres-

ervation of wild Pacific salmon populations.

DFO is also working on a similar initiative for the protection of wild Atlantic salmon and will be working with stakeholders in the near future to develop a draft policy.

## **Workshop Opportunity at the AGM**

Biotelemetry Systems: Theoretical & Pratical Considerations
Presented by: Mitchell M. Sisak, Applied Biometrics Inc., Sponsored by Lotek

This course will examine biotelemetry from both a theoretical and practical perspective. The goal of the workshop is to impart a good understanding of benefits and tradeoffs which must be made during the study design phase of a project. This will permit researchers employing biotelemetry to make informed decisions during the selection of system components, helping to ensure the ultimate success of their projects.

Both acoustic and radio telemetry will be presented in the workshop (duration ~ 3 - 3.5 hours).

Equipment examples provided will apply to commercially available equipment from a variety of manufacturers. Several Application Profiles will be discussed in which actual telemetry studies will be used to demonstrate typical use and features of telemetry equipment.

The ultimate goal of the workshop is not to turn biologists into engineers, but to impart an awareness and appreciation of methods and techniques which can be readily employed to maximize system performance. This information can be applied both during the project design phase as well as assisting in maintaining the required degree of system performance throughout the study through maintenance. Finally, a clearer understanding of system components and their attributes will enable users of biotelemetry equipment to more effectively troubleshoot and repair systems which have failed or suffered a degradation in performance.

Take Hwy #400 N to Barrie, then Hwy #11 N to Orillia. At Orillia, take 2<sup>nd</sup> exit (Hwy #12 S) to Rama Rd (Simcoe County Rd 44). Turn Left. Geneva Park is 10km from corner on left.

#### From Peterborough/Lindsay area & east:


Take Hwy #7 W to Hwy #12 N. Travel 45km on Hwy #12 to Atherley. Turn right onto Rama Rd (Simcoe County Rd 44). Geneva Park is 10km from corner on left.

#### From Huntsville area & north:

Follow Hwy #11 S to the Hwy #169/Washago exit. Follow Hwy #169 one km to Rama Rd (Simcoe County Rd 44). Turn right & follow Rama Rd for 10km. Turn right into Geneva Park.

#### From Georgian Bay area & west:

Take Hwy #26 E through Stayner. Turn left onto County Rd 22 (Horseshoe Valley Rd). Continue on 22 to Hwy #12 (Prices Corners). Turn right onto Hwy #12. Bypass Orillia by taking Hwy #11 S for 3km to Hwy #12 S exit. Take Hwy #12 to Rama Rd (Simcoe County Rd 44). Turn Left. Geneva Park is 10km from corner on left.
