We are also looking at shifting the timing of the weekend this coming year to perhaps attract certain groups for which the third week in March simply does not work. AFS 2003 Annual General Meeting – Quebec City

The 133rd Annual meeting of the AFS is being held at the Quebec Convention Center and the Quebec Hilton in beautiful Quebec City, QC, on August 10-14, 2003. **The theme** of this years meeting is "Worldwide decline of wild fish populations". There will be several exciting speakers at the plenary session, held on Monday August 11, 2003. Included in the list of keynote speakers is the SOC's own Dr. John Cassleman who will be speaking on the declines of fish stocks in the Great lakes and St. Lawrence River. Several AFS-SOC members are also giving either oral or poster presentations.

A very important date to remember is July 11th. You must **register** by this date to receive the early bird rate of US\$295.00 (after July 11th, the rate is US\$395). Student registration is US\$95.00. This registration includes both plenary and technical sessions, all symposia breaks, socials, "goody bag", program, and abstracts CD-ROM. Registration may be done online at: www.fisheries.org or by downloading a pdf form and mailing/faxing it to the head office. Registrations received after August 1st will not be processed at AFS headquarters. After that date registration must be done on site.
